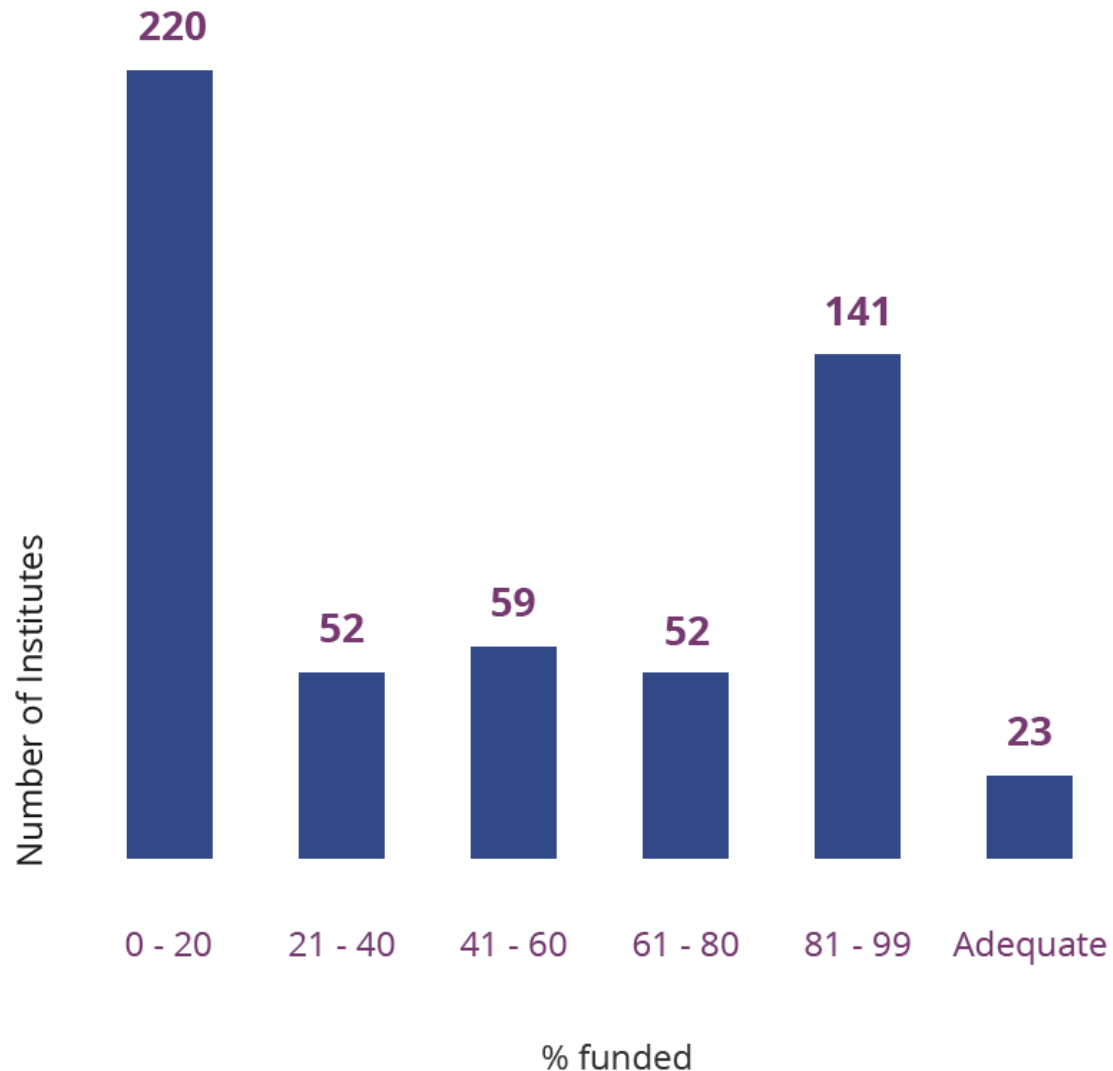
## **National Religious Retirement Office**

## **MEMBERSHIP ENGAGEMENT**

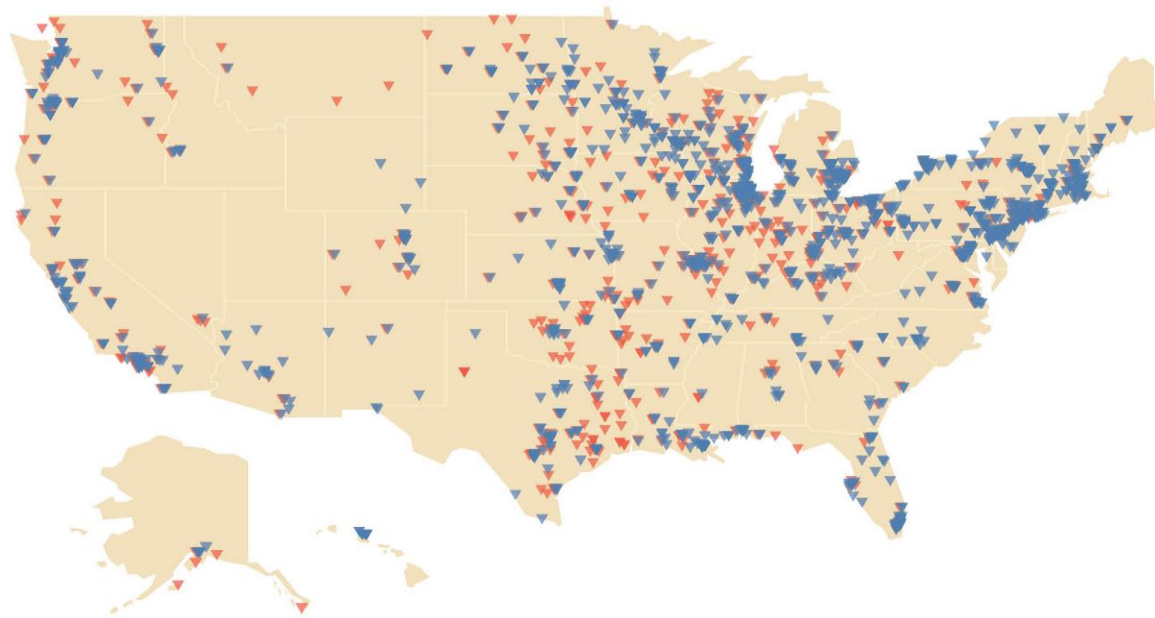

- **86** dioceses “sponsor” Catholic health care
- Hospitals in **142** dioceses
- Continuing Care Ministries in **166** dioceses
- Collaboration with community organizations
- **9** dioceses sponsor their “own” health care system
